So, I have some Easter-related questions, God. I'm wondering – that one dawn, so many years ago, when Jesus came out of his own tomb, did he step haltingly toward the light, or did he run? Did he know who he was right away, or did that take a minute? Did he harbor resentments about his faltering friends or was he free? My Easter request is this: Help us remember that resurrection isn't reversal, that as we return to life, we are carrying our own wounds from loss and isolation. But we are also emerging with new beauty and new wisdom. We are not who we were. But we do get to discover who we are. Help us not foreclose on each other. Maybe just grant us a holy curiosity for a while? Please give me courage to trust the hope I feel right now. Save me from squandering this moment of new life. Remind me that all the fear and cynicism in the world never protects me from pain and disappointment in the way I think they will. Give us back to each other when the time is right. May we recognize you, our wounded and resurrected God, in our belly laughs and crocodile tears... and maybe... even in each other. Amen.


