Words of Integration & Guidance Eckhart Tolle

A true spiritual teacher does not have anything to teach in the conventional sense of the word, does not have anything to give or add to you, such as new information, beliefs, or rules of conduct. The only function of such a teacher is to help you remove that which separates you from the truth of who you already are and what you already know in the depth of your being. The spiritual teacher is there to uncover and reveal to you that dimension of inner depth that is also peace. A true spiritual teacher doesn't say: "Look at me," but "Look beyond me." That to which they point is not to be found within the realm of thought, but a dimension within yourself that is deeper and infinitely vaster than thought. A vibrantly alive peace is one of the characteristics of that dimension, reminding you of who you are and pointing the way back home. Because these thoughts came out of stillness, they have power — the power to take you back into the same stillness from which they arose. That stillness is also inner peace, and that stillness and peace is the essence of your Being. It is the stillness that will save and transform the world. This stillness is in you. The power is in you. The answer is in you. And you are the answer to all your searches: you are the goal. You are the answer. It's never outside.
