Words of Integration & GuidanceMark Wallace

Christianity is a religion that celebrates the enflesh-ment of God in many forms and, in particular, in both human and avian forms. Christianity, in other words, is a religion of double incarnation: God becomes flesh in both humankind and otherkind. My theological point is that as God became human in Jesus, thereby signaling that human beings are the enfleshment of God's presence, so also by becoming avian in the Spirit, God signals that other-than-human beings are the enfleshment of God's presence as well. Christian faith, at its core, centers on belief in God as a fully incarnated reality not only in the humanity of Jesus Christ, but also in the animality, as it were, of the Holy Spirit. If this is the case, is not the wide-ranging world of nonhuman nature-the birds of the air, the fish of the sea, the beasts of the field— the focus of God's interest, not just human wellbeing? And if this is the case as well, should we not, as human beings, comport ourselves toward the natural world in a loving and protective manner because this world is the fullness of God within the life of every creature?
