### **Words of Integration & Guidance**

Rev. Daniel Plasman, from Jesus, A Life

Making room for the new while attempting to hang on to the old is an issue that plagued the early church. Many insisted on merely adding Jesus as a supplement to the established religious traditions, suggesting that Jesus *plus* something creates what God intends. Here are some ways, past and present, that spiritual math works out. Jesus + circumcision = church membership. Jesus + kosher foods = a religious diet. Jesus + speaking in tongues = mature Christianity. Jesus + male gender = godly leadership. Jesus + heterosexual orientation = traditional values. Jesus + free enterprise = God's economy. Jesus + military dominance = one nation under God.


