Words of Integration & Guidance

Jesus never took credit for any of the healing miracles depicted in the Bible. The woman who touched the hem of Jesus' garment was healed without his intervention. He told her, "Daughter, your belief has made you whole." In another miracle, Jesus tells a similar thing to a blind man who is healed: "Go, for your faith has made you well." And, in today's gospel reading, Jesus asks the man at the pool of Bethesda: "Do you want to be made well?" - indicating that the man had to take part in his own healing. Similarly, the centurion who asked for his daughter to be healed was told, "Let it be done to you according to your belief." In our current understanding of the nature of God, our relationship with God, and our own nature, we see that healing is not given to us by any outside power or entity. Healing is brought forth or "revealed" according to one's belief. How does one acquire faith powerful enough to heal oneself? For healing to occur, we need only have the same faith in our own divine nature that we would have placed in Jesus himself. Jesus said, "These and greater things YOU can do." He knew his job was not to heal but to inspire healing by his example. The healing miracles in the Bible are possible to anyone who has the same faith in themselves to heal as those in the Bible stories had in Jesus to heal them. We are not made whole by some mystical outside power, but by the power of our own belief.
