Words of Integration & Guidance by Rev. Thomas Shepherd

It says so much about our human consciousness that many find today's gospel story of the laborers in the vineyard to be the most challenging of all Jesus' parables. In the story, those who labor only a few hours are given the same pay as those who have worked all day. Our sense of fair play is outraged, and we easily feel the indignation of those workers who toiled all day. There must be something more to the story – and indeed, there is. Jesus is talking about the kingdom of heaven and how it isn't a guestion of "deserving." No one truly deserves the kingdom. No one earns it according to who he is, or the work he does. The men in the parable all do one important thing: they accept the invitation of the landowner to labor in his vineyard. It's not the work that is rewarded; it's the choice to accept the invitation. Many people - then and now believe that God maintains a kind of hierarchy. Those who are born into the right religion or class or family are entitled to more. Those who are religiously obedient for all their lives will be favored in the kingdom of heaven. Jesus is saying that we have to leave those human concepts behind. When we make the choice to enter into kingdom consciousness, our reward is full and complete. The Love of God is unconditional; none of the men is denied his share of the blessings, and none of the men receives more than another. All are rewarded for accepting the invitation. From a human perspective this may seem unfair; but it is very good news. There is no hierarchy in the kingdom of heaven. There is only God's unconditional love, made available to all who accept the invitation.


